TERMS AND CONDITIONS

(Unless otherwise specified)

- GENERAL. When the County Chief Procurement Officer issues a purchase document in response to the Vendors bid, a binding contract is created.
- 2. FORM OF SUBMISSION. Bid Offers shall be made on unaltered Bid Offer Forms furnished by San Juan County. Bidders are requested to provide one (1) original Bid. The outside package should identify the project name, bid number, bid opening date and name of bidder. Bidders may submit a Primary Bid and Alternate Bid(s). Each bid must be sealed separately and the outside package should be clearly marked indicating if the Bid is Primary or Alternate.
- 3. <u>DEBARRED</u> OR <u>SUSPENDED</u>

 <u>CONTRACTORS.</u> A business (contractor, subcontractor or supplier) that has either been debarred or suspended pursuant to the requirements of §13-1-177 through §13-1-180, and §13-4-11 through §13-4-17 NMSA 1978 as amended, shall not be permitted to do business with San Juan County and shall not be considered for award of the contract during the period for which it is debarred or suspended.
- 4. <u>VARIATION IN QUANTITY.</u> No variation in quantity of any item called for in this order will be accepted unless such variation has been caused by conditions of loading, shipping, packing or allowances in manufacturing process, and then only to the extent, if any, specified elsewhere in this order.

5. ASSIGNMENT.

- A. Neither the order, nor any interest therein, nor claim thereunder, shall be assigned or transferred by the Vendor, except as expressly authorized in writing by the County Chief Procurement Officer. No such assignment or transfer shall relieve the Vendor from the obligations and liabilities under this order.
- B. Vendor agrees that any and all claims for overcharge resulting from antitrust violations which are borne by the County as to goods, services, and materials purchased in connection with this bid are hereby assigned to the County.
- 6. <u>DISCOUNTS.</u> Prompt payment discounts will not be considered in computing the low bid. Discounts for payment will be considered after the award of the contract. Discounted time will be computed from the date of receipt of the merchandise or invoice, whichever is later.

- 7. INSPECTION. Final inspection and acceptance will be made at the destination. Supplies rejected at the destination for nonconformance with specifications shall be removed, at the Vendor's risk and expense, promptly after notice of rejection.
- 8. <u>INSPECTION OF PLANT.</u> The County Chief Procurement Officer may inspect, at any reasonable time, the part of the contractor's, or any subcontractor's plant or place of business, which is related to the performance of this contract.
- LIABILITY. The Vendor agrees that San Juan County shall not be held liable for any costs incurred in preparation of this bid.
- 10. COMMERCIAL WARRANTY. The Vendor agrees that the supplies or services furnished under this order shall be covered by the most favorable commercial warranties the Vendor gives to any customer for such supplies or services, and that the rights and remedies provided herein shall extend to the County and are in addition to, and do not limit any rights afforded to the County by any other clause of this order. Vendor agrees not to disclaim warranties fitness for a particular purpose of merchantability.
- 11. TAXES. The unit price shall exclude all County/State taxes. Wherever requested in bid response, Vendor shall submit taxes on total bid as a separate unit. Bids shall be awarded on unit price without regard of tax.

12. PACKING, SHIPPING and INVOICING.

- A. The County's purchase document number and the Vendor's name, user's name and location shall be shown on each packing and delivery ticket, package, bill of lading and other correspondence in connection with the shipment. The user's count will be accepted by the Vendor as final and conclusive on all shipments not accompanied by a packing ticket.
- B. Upon delivery, the Vendor's invoice shall be submitted to Accounts Payable, 100 S. Oliver Drive, Aztec, NM 87410, duly certified and shall contain the following information: Purchase order number, description of supplies or services, quantities, unit prices and extended totals. Separate invoices shall be rendered for each and every complete shipment.
- C. In accordance with NMSA 1978, Section 13-1-158 (1997) of the New Mexico

Procurement Code, the Vendor may assess late payment charges on past due accounts (thirty days past receipt and acceptance of the <u>complete order</u> of goods or services by the County) at the rate of one and one-half percent (1½ %) per month of the unpaid balance. Paragraph C of this section also states that if payment is made by mail, the payment shall be deemed tendered on the date it is postmarked.

- 13. **DEFAULT.** The County reserves the right to cancel all or any part of this order without cost to the County, if the Vendor fails to meet the provisions of this order and, except as otherwise provided herein, to hold the Vendor liable for any excess costs if failure to perform the order arises out of causes beyond the control and without the fault or negligence of the Vendor, such causes include but are not restricted to acts of God or the public enemy, acts of the State or Federal government, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions, strikes, freight embargoes, unusually severe weather, and defaults of subcontractors due to any of the above, unless the County shall determine that the supplies or services to be furnished by the subcontractor were obtainable from other sources in sufficient time to permit the Vendor to meet the required delivery schedule. The rights and remedies of the County provided in this paragraph shall not be exclusive and are in addition to any other rights now being provided by law or under this order.
- 14. <u>NON-COLLUSION.</u> In, signing this bid, the Vendor certifies that he/she has not, either directly or indirectly, entered into any action in constraint of free competitive bidding in connection with this proposal submitted to the County Chief Procurement Officer.
- 15. NON-DISCRIMINATION. Vendors doing business with San Juan County must be in compliance with the Federal Civil Rights Act of 1964 and Title VII of the Act, (Rev., 1979), and the Americans Disabilities Act of 1990. (Public Law 101-336).
- 16. IN-STATE RESIDENT PREFERENCE. To be eligible for the 5% resident preference, the bidder shall include a copy of their certificate with their bid and in-state resident preference number on the Bid Offer Page, pursuant to Section 13-1-21 NMSA 1978. Each Bidder may obtain a New Mexico In-State Resident Preference Certificate Number through the State of New Mexico, Department of Taxation and Revenue, 505-827-0951.
- 17. <u>RESIDENT VETERANS PREFERENCE.</u> To be considered for the 10% resident veteran business preference, bidder shall include a copy of their certificate with their bid and resident veterans preference number on the Bid Offer

Page, pursuant to Section 13-1-21 NMSA 1978. Bidder may obtain a Resident Veterans Preference Certificate Number through the State of New Mexico, Department of Taxation and Revenue, 505-827-0951. This preference is separate from the in-state preference and is not cumulative with that preference.

- ITEM/EQUIPMENT CONDITION. All bid items are to be new and of most current production, unless otherwise specified.
- 19. <u>BEST PRICING CONDITION</u>. The bid award does not preclude price changes if deemed beneficial to the County. In recognition of market price fluctuation, Vendor agrees to provide bid items at best possible price to SJC including any available discounts or special pricing that applies. Bid prices reflect the upper limit that applies. Bid prices reflect the upper limit that may be charged for any particular item.
- 20. SAMPLES. Unless otherwise indicated in the bid specifications, samples of the items-when required-shall be furnished free of expense to the County prior to the time set for the opening of bids. Samples not destroyed or mutilated in testing will be returned upon request by mail-express or freight-COLLECT. Each sample must be labeled to clearly show the bid number, item number and bidders name-regardless of any attempt by bidder to condition the bid. Unsolicited bid samples or descriptive literature which are submitted at the bidder's risk, will not be examined or tested, and will not vary from any of the provisions of the Invitation to Bid.
- 21. <u>BID AWARD.</u> San Juan County is not obligated to award to lowest bidder, but reserves the right to accept and/or reject any and all bids, in whole or in part, to waive technical irregularities, and to award to the bidder whose bid is deemed to be in the best interest of the County. The County reserves the right to waive minor irregularities and also reserves the right to waive mandatory requirement(s) so long as all responding vendors fail to meet the mandatory requirement(s) and the failure to do so does not otherwise materially effect the procurement.

Determination of lowest bidder:

Following determination of product acceptability, if any is required, bids will be evaluated to determine which bidder offers the lowest cost to the County in accordance with specifications, terms, & conditions set forth. The County reserves the right to award this Invitation to Bid in total; by groups of items; on the basis of individual items; or any combination of these; or as otherwise specified in bid terms. Alternate Bids may be considered so long as the Primary Bid submitted is the lowest bid meeting the specifications and requirements. Bidders may submit a Primary Bid and Alternate Bid(s). Each bid must be sealed separately and the outside

package should be clearly marked indicating if the Bid is Primary or Alternate.

- 22. RIGHT TO DISCONTINUE PROCUREMENT.

 The County reserves the right to cancel this INVITATION TO BID at any time, and to reject any or all bids, or otherwise to proceed in the best interests of the County. This in no manner obligates the County or any of its agencies to the eventual purchase of any product or service, whether explicitly described or implied herein, until confirmed by a written contract and/or Purchase Order.
- 23. FOB DESTINATION. Destination: Means goods are to be delivered to the destination identified in the Purchase Order by the user, which is the point at which the user accepts ownership or title to goods. Laws of New Mexico specifically prohibit acceptance of ownership of goods in transit. ANY exception to FOB Destination may cause a bid to be declared non-responsive.
- 24. <u>INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS.</u> Contractor shall carry and maintain insurance from an insurance company or companies with a Best Rating of A, or better, authorized to do business in the State of New Mexico in the following amounts:

Workers Compensation – Statutory limits pursuant to the New Mexico Workers Compensation Act.

The certificate shall specifically provide that the coverage afforded under the policy or policies will not be cancelled or be materially changed until prior written notice has been given to the County. The County shall be named as additional insured on the General Liability Insurance policy. The Contractor shall supply a copy of the appropriate certificates of insurance to the County for each year in which the contract is in effect.

25. <u>LATE BIDS.</u> Any bid received after the specified time and date will be declared a "Late Bid" and will NOT be considered.

26. SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS.

A. To preclude possible errors and/or misinterpretations, bid prices must be affixed LEGIBLY in ink, or typewritten. Corrections or changes must be signed or initialed by bidder prior to scheduled bid opening. Failure to do so will be just cause for rejection of bid. The Bid shall be stated in both numerals and written

- words. In case of discrepancies, the amount in written words shall govern.
- B. Clarifications and questions must be addressed to the County Chief Procurement Officer in sufficient time to provide a written response to all prospective bidders.
- C. Bids may be withdrawn upon receipt of written request, prior to scheduled bid opening for the purpose of making any corrections and or changes. Such corrections must be properly identified and signed or initialed by bidder. Resubmittal must also be prior to scheduled bid opening for consideration.
- D. After bid opening, no modifications on bid prices or other provisions shall be permitted. A low bidder alleging a material mistake of fact-after bids have been opened-may be permitted to withdraw the bid upon written request prior to award at the discretion of the County Chief Procurement Officer. Bidders shall hold their bid pricing for thirty (30) days after bid opening.
- E. Specifications on the bid are not meant to exclude any bidder or manufacturer. Where a brand name or equal is indicated, it is for the purpose of describing the standard of quality, performance, and characteristics desired and are NOT intended to restrict competition. "No Substitute" specifications may be authorized ONLY if required to match existing equipment.

INTRODUCTION

San Juan County is requesting proposals from qualified companies to provide technical services for an outdoor surveillance camera and control room project. The project includes the supply, installation and connection of cameras, radio antennas, server, workstation setup, and training, as well as the maintenance, service and repair of said equipment.

SPECIFICATIONS AND REQUIREMENTS

SCOPE.

San Juan County Office of Emergency Management invites sealed bids from qualified vendors for the Purchase and Installation of New Outdoor Surveillance Cameras and Control Room Equipment & Furniture for the City of Farmington Police Department, N.M. The awarded bidder shall be expected to provide a seamless integration of outdoor surveillance cameras to be installed at various street intersections within the Farmington city limits with the equipment in the Control Room at the Farmington Police Department. The services include, but are not limited to, equipment, installation, warranty and maintenance support. The awarded bidder shall be expected to provide an emergency response time for equipment issues.

All equipment must be new, and should be from the manufacturer's current product line. Used, refurbished, or previously sold equipment will not be accepted. The equipment and furniture specifications are listed under the **Technical Specifications** below and brand names are "or **Equal**."

The selected bidder will provide accurate and detailed workmanship along with a timely manner of completion of the project after the bid is awarded and an agreed upon start date is established. The user department is requesting a completion date of 90 days after bid award.

Bidders shall specify date of completion after receipt of order on the Bid Offer Page, page 16.

PRE-BID CONFERENCE

Pre-Bid Conference will be on Thursday, March 24, 2020 at 10 a.m. at the Farmington Police Department Briefing Room, 900 Municipal Drive, Farmington N.M. All bidders may submit questions in writing via email to the following email address: kbegay@sjcounty.net by Thursday, March 26, 2020 by 5:00 pm. An Addendum will be issued to respond to questions.

METHOD OF AWARD.

The bid shall be awarded to the overall low Bidder meeting the specifications and requirements. San Juan County reserves the right to waive irregularities, reject offers, in whole or in part, and award this Bid in the best interest of the County.

Alternate Bids may be considered for award so long as the Primary Bid submitted is the lowest bid meeting the specifications and requirements.

PRICE AGREEMENT TERM.

The primary term of the proposed agreement shall become effective upon award. The term will be one year with an option to renew for one more year, upon mutual agreement of both parties. The agreement may also be renewed for a period less than one full year.

Any price agreement awarded as a result of this solicitation shall be nonexclusive. During the term of the agreement, the County reserves the right to solicit additional bids or quotations, and purchase services from other sources, when deemed in the best interest of the County.

PRICE ADJUSTMENTS FOR ADDITIONAL YEAR TERMS.

During the initial term, prices which are bid and accepted pursuant to this solicitation shall be firm and fixed. In the event of contract renewal for an additional one (1) year term, the contract unit price shall be firm for the duration of the contract, unless otherwise stipulated in the special provision(s) identified below.

The price redetermination documentation shall follow one of the six (6) price adjustment parameters the bidder has identified on the Bid Offer, page 14, and which has been mutually agreed upon by the County prior to bid

award.

Renewal price adjustment shall be by the Manufacturer Discount Percentage listed on the Bid Forms (Pages 11-14) and the contract shall be modified accordingly.

- Consumers Price Index (CPI): The price to be paid shall be increased or decreased by 100% of the change as reflected by the All Items Index of the Consumers Price Index published by the U.S. Department of Labor for the proceeding twelve (12) months; OR
- 2. Producer's Price Index (PPI): The price to be paid shall be increased or decreased by 100% of the change as reflected by a mutually agreed industry Code of the Producers Price Index published by the U.S. Department of Labor; OR
- 3. Manufacturer's Catalogue Price List: Prices will be based on the current manufacturer list price less the applicable discounted listed. Current catalogs and price lists must be readily available to the County and provided before the revision goes into effect; OR
- Established Catalogue Published Price List: Prices will be based on the current published list price less the applicable discount listed. Current catalogues and price lists must be readily available to the County and provided before the revision goes into effect; OR
- Manufacturer's Documented Price Adjustment: The price to be paid shall be increased or decreased by 100% of the change as reflected in the price supporting documentation as supplied by the manufacturer; OR
- 6. Bidder's Suggested Alternate: If the Bidder is suggesting an alternate price redetermination method, the Bidder must submit in it's bid documents the suggested contract language along with any pricing documentation identified. This recommended contract language and pricing documentation must be mutually agreed upon by both parties prior to bid award.

Prior to acceptance of any price increase, the Contractor shall submit a written request identifying the reason for the price increase to Central Purchasing no less than sixty (60) days prior to the expiration of the current term of the contract. No retroactive price adjustment will be allowed.

The Office of Central Purchasing shall notify the Contractor in writing of its acceptance and/or rejection of the said price increase.

USE OF CONTRACT BY OTHER AGENCIES.

Pursuant to Section 13-1-129, NMSA 1978, Bidders/Contractors/Offerors are hereby notified that any central purchasing office allowed by law and as otherwise allowed by their respective governing rules and regulations, may contract for the goods and/or services included in this procurement document with the awarded Bidder/Contractor/Offeror. Contractual engagements accomplished under this provision shall be solely between the Bidder/Contractor/Offeror and the contracting entity with no obligation by San Juan County.

ESTIMATED QUANTITIES.

Quantities are estimated only. The County does not guarantee a minimum quantity to be purchased during the term of the contract. The County reserves the right to:

- Order more or less than the quantity listed.
- · Add or delete items from the contract.
- · Not order some items on the list.

PRICING.

Bid pricing, which is offered and accepted pursuant to this solicitation, shall be firm and fixed for thirty (30) days after bid opening. **Pricing shall be all-inclusive:** preparation, parts/materials, labor, permit(s) and delivery costs, **F.O.B: City of Farmington Police Department, 900 Municipal Drive, Farmington, NM 87401.** Hourly rates to include travel and per diem.

Bidder is required to absorb all delivery costs. The County will not be liable for any delivery, storage, packing, freight charge involved in the shipment of the items. Pricing includes any troubleshooting for a seamless integration.

DELIVERY.

Bidder shall be responsible for transporting all ordered products to the end user's facility prior to installation. The bidder shall be responsible for loading, and unloading of material or equipment associated with this project. The end user will not be responsible for risk of loss for any materials delivered to its facility prior to the bidder completing installation of the product.

The bidder will unbox equipment and examine equipment for damage. Equipment can be stored in control room. The bidder's final documentation provided to the City representative will list the inventory of the installed equipment. A copy will be emailed to the County.

MATERIALS AND WORKMANSHIP:

All materials furnished by the bidder shall be new and shall be free from defects and imperfections. The County reserves the right to inspect materials provided by the bidder from this Bid to determine their quality, fitness and suitability.

Workmanship shall be in accord with the best industry standards and practices. Both materials and workmanship shall be subject to the approval of the County.

CLEARANCE, ACCESS, AND RESPONSIBILITY.

The awarded bidder shall coordinate with the Farmington Police Department, and the City of Farmington Traffic Division, to obtain access to the street traffic signal intersections and to the control room site to perform the installation and integration of the new system.

The awarded bidder shall perform all work during normal business hours Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. The exception being the East Main Street corridor from Hutton Avenue to English Road, all intersection work requiring any lane closure will be done after 8:00 p.m. For work to be completed at the Police Department, the Contractor will be required to sign in and be escorted to the work area. Contractors' employees must adhere to security policies.

The Lead Technician or Project Manager shall be responsible for the performance of its team members. The bidder warrants that all services shall be rendered in a good and workmanlike manner by skilled personnel in compliance with all applicable laws and regulations.

HARDWARE FOOTPRINT FOR CAMERA INSTALLATION AT TRAFFIC SIGNAL INTERSECTIONS.

Feed from all cameras to be transmitted to the Control room for viewing and for storage. The outdoor surveillance system consists of both radio and fiber optic infrastructure with all camera connections. The video is then sent from each camera to the City's network by fiber or wireless ethernet for distribution to the Control Room at the Farmington Police Department. Installation shall be performed by a qualified electrician with the appropriate New Mexico licensure.

Bid shall include the following equipment and installation per location:

- 1. Strong Poles SP-PTM fly over camera mount
- 2. Stainless steel strapping 3/2" .030 thickness with break strength of 2250lbs minimum.
- 3. Stainless steel strapping seals 3/4"
- 4. Cat6 Shielded Direct Burial Black Ethernet cable 550MHz; 23awg 4pairs; Water Blocking tape with UV resistant jacket (Estimate 100 meters per installation)
- 5. 1/2" CGB with locknut appropriately sized for above listed Ethernet cable.
- 6. Estimate 2 Cat6 shielded RJ45 connectors per location
- 7. 802.3at PoE+ Gigabit power injector.
- 8. 3' Cat6 Ethernet jumper

Installation narrative:

Flyover mount shall be mounted at the highest feasible point on traffic signal mast. 34" stainless steel strapping and 34" stainless steel strapping seals will be utilized at the top and bottom of the mounting plate. A 12" CGB will be used to penetrate the signal mast at a location to be designated by City of Farmington Traffic Engineering. Appropriately terminated Cat6 cabling will be routed from Camera system to the mast with a drip loop before entering the 12" CGB. The cabling will run through the mast to the underground conduit and routed to the Signal Cabinet where it will terminate into the 802.3at POE+ Gigabit power

injector located on the top shelf of the Signal Cabinet. A 3' Cat6 Ethernet jumper will attach the POE to existing Switch.

Notes:

- A. City of Farmington Traffic Engineering will supervise installation and provide IP Addressing for each device. Traffic Engineering will specify the specific location on the mast for Flyover camera mount, CGB penetration and proper conduit routing.
- B. After installation and termination of Cat6 cabling, it shall be tested to industry standard for conductivity.
- C. A City of Farmington Signal Technician must be present while work is being performed at any Traffic Signal facilities. All scheduling must be approved by the Senior Signal Technician prior to starting the project.
- D. All Federal, State and Local safety requirements shall be adhered to.
- E. Traffic Control Plans shall be submitted to the Traffic Engineer 1 week prior to any lane restriction or closure. Traffic Engineering is available for guidance in developing a traffic control plan.
- F. All lane closures on East Main Street from Hutton Avenue to English Road shall be after 8 p.m.

OUTDOOR SURVEILLANCE CAMERAS AND AXIOM RADIO ANTENNA.

The awarded bidder shall supply and install new outdoor surveillance cameras, radio antennas, network video recorders, wireless and wired access points, cable, camera mounts, and miscellaneous hardware. Bidder must have experience in the installation of PTZ camera on traffic signal poles. Installation is defined as the mounting of individual PTZ camera on City owned traffic signal poles via mounting bracket and connecting cameras and radio antennas to a power source and providing live and recorded video to a remote location via wireless or fiber optic cable.

The Axiom radio antenna requested on this bid for 1 intersection, LaPlata Highway and Pinon Hills, is due to standardization with the current traffic control system and Axion radio antennas installed at other established intersections. Eleven (11) intersection cameras will be connecting to fiber for data transmission with CAT6 to the camera and back to the intersection box. The other seven (7) intersection cameras are being installed specifically to Axiom radio antennas with CAT6 to the camera and back to the intersection box.

The installation of cameras to either fiber or wireless radio at each intersection is dependent upon location and current infrastructure. A dedicated private network will be setup to tie back to the command center for camera viewing and storage. All future radio antenna service will be done by the City of Farmington as established by current procedures.

After cameras are mounted, adjustments may be required in terms of aim and focus to achieve desired field of view.

The security camera must be able to record and archive up to 7 days of video, and be able to record both day and night activity. There must not be any audio for the streaming cameras or the archived video.

All outdoor cameras and radio antenna will be installed with a sealed waterproof connector and associated patch cable. The bidder shall clean housings, and enclosures, and inspect for leaks or potential leaks or other damage.

CONTROL ROOM EQUIPMENT AND FURNITURE.

The awarded vendor shall provide and install the equipment necessary for the video wall, computers, and workstations inside the Control Room. The Control Room is located at the Farmington Police Department, 900 Municipal Drive, Farmington N.M. The dimensions of the floor plan is on Exhibit A and the layout of the equipment and furniture are on Exhibit B and C.

The awarded Bidder will ensure installed equipment communicates with every specified intersection through a designated IP address back to the control room computers and servers for monitoring and recording purposes. The bidder is responsible for providing a video management software solution within the bid to allow for multi-intersection live stream, navigation, PTZ camera manipulation, position memory and multi-intersection views at the computer monitors and the video wall. The recording and storage of video information will be to a specified server(s) for no more than 7 days.

The bidder will assemble and install the racks and furniture as designated by the City of Farmington Police Department. The Farmington Police Department will approve the final placement of racks/furniture prior to equipment installation. Equipment shall be installed employing proper length patch cables and cable management.

Bidder shall follow the R56 guidance for installation of communication equipment. The contractor shall be responsible for proper connection between the UPS, Equipment, and Rack, etc. The contractor shall also provide the required data cabling, supply & install boxes, faceplates, RJ45 connectors, crimping, piping and tagging of the materials.

Bidder shall follow the ANSI/HFES 100-2007, Human Factors Engineering for Computer Workstations which provides guidance for the design and installation of computer workstations, including displays, input devices, and furniture to accommodate a wide variety of users. Furniture provided must be commercial grade, i.e. durable, easily maintained, and have longer-lasting value. It must be built for heavy and continual use.

INSTALLATION/LABOR.

Installation will include all unpacking, hardware, mounting, connecting cables, installing and configuring set-up on workstations. There will be no exposed cabling, any exterior conduit will have compression fittings or be threaded in accordance with applicable codes.

Bidder shall provide the fully loaded maximum hourly rates which must include travel and per diem for bidder's personnel.

CABLING.

The awarded bidder shall be responsible for determining the most appropriate cable route, cable lengths, type of conduit, and type of cabling and fasteners to be installed. Bidder must pull, install, and terminate cable based on industry standards. This bid is inclusive of all accessories, cables, conduits, etc.

All cabling provided shall be in accordance with the highest standards among the latest applicable editions

of National Electrical Code (NEC), Electronics Industry Association (EIA), Telecommunications Industry Association, American National Standards Institute, (ANSI), and regulations, laws, safety orders, ordinances or codes of local authority. Violations of these standards, statutes, ordinances and regulations shall be corrected at no cost to the County.


